Improvement in Writing

You may remember that in January, our teaching staff took part in a training day with our partner primary schools from the Together Learning Trust. This was delivered remotely by literacy consultant, Philip Webb, with a focus on improving standards of writing through a three staged approach, writing for a purpose and the use of quality texts. Since then, a group of Year 2 and Year 5 children have been taught via Zoom using these strategies, whilst supervised by their class teacher, who therefore also received training by default. A Year 6 workshop is to take place after Easter. We have also developed a new strategy for writing which you can find at 'English – Meltham Moor Primary School'. We are already seeing the impact of this strategy in the quality of the children's writing - which is fabulous! The children are also able to talk with pride about their writing and explain what they have learnt. We are looking forward to sharing our progress with Netherton and Bolton Brow when we meet for our curriculum communities meeting next week.
