

From September 2023, our school nursery is extending its hours to offer full-time places!

#### 15 Hours:

All children, starting the term after they turn three, are entitled to fifteen hours of FREE childcare. We will continue providing this in the mornings (8.55-11.55) with no extra fees or top-ups. For more flexibility, please ask, and we will see what we can do.

#### 30 Hours:

Working parents can claim 30 hours of FREE childcare from 8.55-3pm. Check your eligibility at www.childcarechoices.gov.uk. We can offer 30 hours free of charge to those entitled to it, without any additional fees or top-ups. If you need extra childcare outside these hours, Moor Fun will continue to provide wraparound and holiday clubs.

#### Additional Hours:

We can also offer additional nursery hours beyond the usual entitlement.

Prices are as follows:
Additional full days: £30
Additional half-day sessions (9-12 or 12-3): £15
Lunch Club: Extend until 1pm for just £5 per day

Plus, every day, children enjoy a FREE fruit snack and carton of milk. Parents are kindly asked to provide a healthy packed lunch.

We do believe our nursery provides a fantastic start for our children at Meltham Moor. It supports them to settle quickly into school life and make important early friendships.

# **Sharing of Work Afternoon**

Please ensure that your child attends school as usual as we will continue to follow our school absence procedure. If you decide not to send your child on these days, please notify the office beforehand so that their absence can be marked in the register and we do not need to follow it up on the day. The children in KS2 will be organised into 2 groups and will complete non-curriculum activities with a teacher. Children with EHCPs will be provided with support but this may be a different member of staff if staff need to be absent due to their own childcare issues. We will endeavour to give you prior notice of this. School meals will be provided as normal, for those who have them. We thank you once again for your patience, support and understanding.


#### **Decorate a Cup Competition**
